
Dear Parents/Guardians,

I would like to take this opportunity to welcome you and your child back to Jessie Duncan School for another school year. This year, your child will be in a 2/3 blend class. This is good news. It means that your child will have the opportunity to develop stronger independent work skills, work cooperatively with others and will benefit from a wider range of learning opportunities. Children in grade two will have opportunities for more challenge and students in the upper grade will have the learning from their previous year reinforced and enriched. Older children will also be peer tutors – a win-win situation for children in both grades. By their very nature, combined classrooms are a little more flexible and enable children to work at different levels and to develop a wider range of interests.


